

Carol O'Connor-Eisenberg will be teaching painting on scarves. You should have already signed up and let Carol know your choice of colors and how many you would like to purchase from her.

Designer Silk Scarf Class
Taught by Carol O'Connor-Eisenberg

You need to bring 3 or more stencil brushes, blue painters tape, paper towels, a fine tip sharpie, and water dish large enough to wet your scarves. Because stenciling is done with a dry brush, I recommend you bring at least one stencil brush for each color you plan to use. Ideally, brushes no larger than 1/2" work best for this application. If necessary, you can clean your brush with hand sanitizer between colors as it dries faster than water.

We will be using Jacquard textile/metallic paints and Color Hue dyes. These plus the stencils and other materials needed will be provided. I have literally hundreds of stencils for you to choose from in a wide variety of subjects to include sea shells, sea life, flowers, birds, butterflies, dragonflies, peacocks, scrolls, borders, alphabets for monograms, etc. If you have a particular stencil that you would prefer to use, by all means feel free to bring it.
