We had new faces at our meeting which are always welcome. There is lots to do and be a part of.



Seminars will be handled differently.

They started by preparing our enlargements for transferring onto the back wall. Bev, Jean and Carole also completed measuring and drawing the siding, window trim and railing on the two "house fronts" with a few details yet to add. Debbie, Kathy, Barbara and Ellen measured out the "back wall" design and transferred the outlines onto it with a scaffold and ladders. Our next tentative date for a second get-together will be on Sunday, March 3rd (the day after our next chapter meeting) and we'll be ready to start painting!

Debbie gave Ellen eight "department signs" which are made of a lightweight foam-core board which has been primed white to add some "tooth". Basic 1 Class....

Our Basic 1 Classes on side loading and floating will be held February through June. Teachers will come to your home or you go to their studios for free. The Chapter will pay the teachers \$10 per student. The project is a flowered pattern pictured here. After you complete the class and the teacher passes you, you will then do a picture on your own using the techniques you learned. The member will then receive an angle paint brush and a small Masterson Palette. The Presidents letter in this Newsletter has the list of the teachers. Below is the line drawing for a six inch round box. Your teacher will give you the material list and prep instructions.







PAINTED SHIRT OR APRON

Wash shirt or Apron and dry. DO NOT USE FABRIC SOFTENER!!

COLORS YOU WILL NEED ARE Deco-Art: Alizarin Crimson, Avocado, Cad Yellow, Cad Orange, Olive Green, Ant. Rose, White, Cherry Red, White, Black, Dioxazine Purple, Sapphire.

BRUSHES #2 and #4 flat, #1 liner and #4 or #6 fabric scrubber. FABRIC PAINTING MEDIUM SHIRT BOARD

Trace on pattern.

Preparation:

Sand, seal and sand wood. Basecoat the top, where the pattern will go, with Sandstone. Let dry. Sand and wipe clean, then apply another coat. When dry, sand again with a small piece of brown paper bag. Basecoat the sides (where no pattern will be) Cayenne.

Transfer pattern onto tracing paper, but do not trace onto wood. Bring traced pattern to class. To get nice straight line on buildings & roofs, use the small ruler.
