Hi Ladies,

Thanks everyone for another nice meeting with lots of input and discussion from y'all. Margaret taught a cute and relaxing pen and ink with colored pencil; we all had fun with the raffles and show and tell is always a treat.

We are looking forward to Louise Jackson's Seminar this month. You will find her a delight. The projects are some of the best we have done in years and I think even beginners will be pleased. She will be selling her brushes and palettes and maybe some other things. I love her two ended brush and often paint a whole picture with just that brush. I have heard that others find it awkward with hair on both ends and know some people who have cut it in half. But it was worth the money to me. (\$20, 8 years ago) You may of course, bring your own brushes, colors and paper, but let Linda Duff know ahead of time if you are bringing your own paints and art board or she will assume you want her to order them for you.

In April we are having the Basket Lunch Exchange. It was so much fun seeing the creativity of the containers brought in by members. We call it basket, but you may use a pail, flower pot, tote bag or any other item that you can paint up and fill with a lunch. Keep the lunch simple – a sandwich, chips, drink and cookies or fruit. The actual lunches may be stored in the fridge in a bag to prevent spoilage. Please consider participating! It is not a contest and they don't have to be elaborate. It is always more fun when everybody joins in – and you have plenty of time to paint it.

In April I was scheduled to teach a short class on faux carving, but I got a sample package from DecoArt with lots of products that I would like to demo on glass and then teach a design similar to Margo's Mud since there was interest in that. So bring a glass object to paint on. A plate, vase, wine bottle or flower pot would be good. It is better if it doesn't have a printed design but it can be colored, frosted or tinted glass.

We are not having a formal meeting with all committee reports because of Louise's seminar, but we will have Show and Tell, Birthday Raffle, Painted Piece Raffle and breakfast goodies.

March 1st and 2nd......Our "Big Brush" Watercolor Seminar with Louise Jackson

Hi everyone, hope you all are getting excited about the upcoming seminar with Louise Jackson on the 1st, and 2nd. of March. So far we have 20 people signed up. Some are for both days, and some for just Saturday, and some for just Sunday. We still have room for a few more so if anyone wants to change there mind that would be great, and also if anyone knows someone who would want to come, please let me know.

Pat Otto has been kind enough to take care in ordering the art board that we will be painting on. The cost for that will be approximately 3.00 each, I think she said she was going to order 30 so we would have plenty. Also the palettes of paint that we will be using will be 6.00 each day and that will come from Louise Jackson. She suggested we purchase them from her because then we would all be using the same colors (brand). Below I am attaching what she says we should bring.

Supply List for Louise Jackson M.D.A. Seminars.

Brushes: by Royal Langnickel - this is my signature line made for Louise Jackson M.D.A, 1 inch flat which is a mix of natural hair and synthetic. #705
20 flat which is a synthetic bright. This is my double ended brush.
12 round which is a synthetic bright. This is the on the other end.
Stiff scrubber #475. Soft scrubber #179-s
6 round #425
You may obtain the brushes from me. If you have a 1 inch flat, bring it.

Please bring a WATERCOLOR PALETTE or several white plastic plates. No styrofoam.

VERY IMPORTANT TOOL! I use 4 squares of Viva paper towel wrapped around a roll of Charmin to pull the water out of my brush. It is important to learn how long it take to get the water out and this works as a very absorbent tool. I use 1 roll of Charmin per painting.

Winsor & Newton Art Masking Fluid. Stylus. Rubber cement pick up.

1 Inch Masking Tape .PLEASE, NO BLUE TAPE. It is difficult to judge your colors against it. I use a paint store variety of masking tape. HAIR DRYER.

WAX FREE gray graphite: Sue Scheewe's or Sally's work well. Take a paper towel and rub to remove all of the excess graphite. If you don't it will smudge the paper. I always have some to lend. Have a good clean eraser and several pencils.

Use two water containers. One to rinse your color in and one to pick up clean water from.

For the IRIS please bring. 8x11 Plastic sleeve, scissors __ old bath or beach towel.__ 1 inch masking tape__. Plastic kitchen wrap __.

PAPER for Colorful White Rose can be a 16 x 20 Arches Cold Press Art Board or Arches 300 lb. Cold Press paper cut to 16 x 20.

Paper for Moonlit IRIS can be done on Arches 16 x 20 Cold Press Art Board or 140lb. cold press paper with a support board.

Watercolor palette of paint will be available to purchase at \$6.00 per painting. This includes Dr. PH Martins liquid

watercolor which is used on both painting

It's Strawberry time in Florida..Pat Thompson wanted to pass this delicious recipe on to all of you. She says she took out all the calories!!!!

Strawberry Refrigerator Cake

- 1 Strawberry cake mix
- 2 10oz boxes frozen strawberries in syrup thawed –or fresh ripe ones
- 1 cup cold milk
- 1 box Vanilla instant pudding
- 1 8oz container Cool Whip thawed

Make cake mix according to directions - cool completely - poke holes in cake with the handle of a wooden spoon

Put strawberries in food processor or blender and pulse until slushy - then pour strawberries over cake - spread out evenly and let soak in.

Prepare instant pudding with ONE cup of milk - when thickened, fold in cool whip - spread evenly over cake

Cool in refrigerator at least 4 hours.

Dazzling Metallics-

Festive Green Renaissance Brown

Multi-Purpose Sealer
Faux Glazing Medium
Texture Glass
Tracy Moreau Texture StencilsRoyal Tile (TS07)
Scrapbook Paper of Choice
Cosmetic Sponge
12 x 12 wrapped Canvas
Water Basin, Stylis, Palette Knife, Tracing Paper, Grey Graphite

BRUSHES-1/4 AND 1/2 angulars 10/0 liner 1" wash #4 round 1/4 " deerfoot Small domed round

PREP- Basecoat the canvas with Driftwood using your 1" wash brush. Allow this to dry.


Tear the edges of the scrapbook paper. When you rip the paper, pull the pieces towards you. This will allow some of the underneath paper to show.

Apply a heavy layer of Multi-Purpose Sealer on the canvas. Lay scrapbook paper onto the wet surface. Brush out any air bubbles that might appear with your wash brush. Do not overbrush! The wet paper will tear. Allow this to dry overnight.

Mix Renaissance Brown with Faux Glazing Medium. Apply a layer of this mixture over the entire canvas. Working quickly, wipe off excess with a piece of paper towel.

Please check the photo under Programs to see the placement of the line drawing on the canvas.







For those of you who would like to improve your drawing skills we are again giving you a practice project each month.
