Letter from the PREZ :

Hi Everyone,

We have had a busy year so far. Louise Jackson taught an incredible seminar. We have a fifth Saturday this month and some of us are venturing off to the Florida State Retreat.

April will start with our Lunch Exchange in a decorated container. I have mine finished. Hope you are working on yours as it is so much fun when there are lots of choices. I can't wait to see how creative everyone will be.

Don't forget Secret Sister, our raffle of raw wood pieces and the drawing in the newsletter. We will, of course, have the Birthday Raffle and Show and Tell.

I will be demo/teaching some of the pieces I displayed last month done with Deco Art glass paint. There are a variety of techniques and Deco Art sent some paint so if you don't want to do the one I am teaching you can try another technique. They sent a DVD with basic instructions. Bring a glass object such as a vase or ornament, either clear or opaque. This works best with soft inexpensive brushes. Bring paper towels, brushes, any palette and a surface. There is no pattern.

Since we will have more time to discuss things I would like to have some input on a fall function. We have been having Tables and Treasures every other year. I do not want to head that up this year. If someone is willing to do it we can discuss that. T&T was always so nice I would like to stop before it goes downhill and people lose interest. We also need a Christmas Party chairman. One idea to discuss is having a new program this year that combines the Christmas Party and T&T. The suggestion was to have a Christmas Brunch that we sell tickets to. We would have hostesses that decorate the tables with different centerpieces (but not place settings) and have the basket raffle and Chinese auction. Members can invite their friends and all can participate in all raffles, and get favors. Ideas have been discussed on how it would work, but nothing decided yet.

I know this is a BIG departure from the norm and no one likes change! But it would save having two committees and two functions close together requiring work from everyone at a busy time of the year. As I said it will be something to talk about and hear your input on – that's why I am giving you a "heads up" to think about it beforehand and talk it over in your groups.

Dazzling Metallics-

Festive Green Renaissance Brown

Multi-Purpose Sealer
Faux Glazing Medium
Texture Glass
Tracy Moreau Texture StencilsRoyal Tile (TS07)
Scrapbook Paper of Choice
Cosmetic Sponge
12 x 12 wrapped Canvas
Water Basin, Stylis, Palette Knife, Tracing Paper, Grey Graphite

BRUSHES-1/4 AND 1/2 angulars 10/0 liner 1" wash #4 round 1/4 " deerfoot Small domed round

PREP- Basecoat the canvas with Driftwood using your 1" wash brush. Allow this to dry.


Tear the edges of the scrapbook paper. When you rip the paper, pull the pieces towards you. This will allow some of the underneath paper to show.

Apply a heavy layer of Multi-Purpose Sealer on the canvas. Lay scrapbook paper onto the wet surface. Brush out any air bubbles that might appear with your wash brush. Do not overbrush! The wet paper will tear. Allow this to dry overnight.

Mix Renaissance Brown with Faux Glazing Medium. Apply a layer of this mixture over the entire canvas. Working quickly, wipe off excess with a piece of paper towel.

Please check the photo under Programs to see the placement of the line drawing on the canvas.






For those of you who would like to improve your drawing skills we are again giving you a practice project each month.
