Programs... Seminars and Workshops: Linda Duff and Kathi Bruckner

May 31rd Workshop (Fifth Saturday)...with Carole Sheftic

Carole will be teaching this Glenice Moore design of Two Zebras, titled FRIENDS.

The class fee is \$10 for the full day workshop. Please bring a lunch. The Class starts at 9 a.m.

It is done in Traditions Acrylics on a 12x16 canvas. Carole will be furnishing the paints and mediums. The pattern was handed out at the May 3rd workshop. So that we can get the project completed on May 31st the pattern must be completely traced on the canvas before coming to class. There is Prep to be done so do not put it off



until the last minute. Detail prep is on our web site www.naturecoastdecorativeartists.com The pattern **WILL NOT** be on the website or this Newsletter, so please see Carole if other arrangements need to be made for you to get the pattern. (*csheftic@bellsouth.com*) Suggested Brushes needed: One or two...³/₄ or 1 inch flat background brush (like a one stoke). Your favorite ¹/₄ to ¹/₂ inch flats or angles, a ¹/₄ or ¹/₂ inch rake, small detail rounds for small areas and your favorite liner. A Wet Palette is a good addition for this workshop

June 7th Workshop:

Along with our Summer Picnic we will have a short paint-along-demo of how to paint a Basket Weave. You will need three values of one color plus white. Pat will be using (acrylics) Burnt Umber, Burnt Sienna, Antique Gold and White for a natural look. Colored Basket weave accents on the side of a box to match your painted design will look nice as well. Bring a box of any type painted off white or bring some stiff boards

such as mat board and practice different colors in drawn rectangles to add to your reference file. Other supplies: a pencil and small ruler, plus usual acrylic painting items.

July 5th Workshop: Reverse Glass Scene



Pat Otto has come up with a project that may be new to you or one you may have tried before but she had added a new twist to it. It is a reverse glass done in two steps. The glass will be inked and painted with oils (in reverse) and the background will be done in acrylics.

The Frame and glass size that she used is 7x17 and she got it at Walmart. So we are letting you know in plenty of time to find the glass and frame. Below is the picture of the frame (you do not use the mats) and also a picture of the crow quill pen that you will need. You will be using Higgins Fountain Pen India Ink and Pat says that she will have some to share if you do not have any.

Pat will be furnishing both the oils and the acrylics for this workshop. Besides the crow quill pen, you need to bring brushes and a piece of canvas paper or mat board painted white 7" x 17" for your background scene.

Bring your usual supplies for acrylic and oils.


- •Disposable or Dry Wax Palette

- •Graphite paper (light and dark)
- •Tracing paper for transferring patterns
- •Ruler to measurement placement
- •Scissors
- •Palette Knife
- Cotton Swabs
- •Chalk Pencil
- •Ball Point Pen (for note taking)
- •Notepad (to take class notes)
- •Kneaded Eraser (Art Eraser) to remove pattern lines
- •Masking or painters' tape
- •Brushes (your favorites)
- •A bottle of your base coat color for touch-up
- •Sponge Roller for base coating, optional
