Programs... Seminars and Workshops: Linda Duff and Kathi Bruckner

July 5th Workshop: Reverse Glass Scene by Pat Otto

1) Your surface will be a certificate size frame with 8 ½ x 11 glass,

available at Wal-Mart for under \$5. Originally I used a longer frame that had a 6 x 17 glass, but I had trouble finding them. If you are adept at stretching a pattern, which would involve spacing out the trees and/or adding limbs and leaves at the top, you could bring another size frame and adjust the pattern. Obviously I can't adapt everyone's pattern to any size frame that day, so if you are unsure, bring the certificate size frame to the class and do the project and then try adjusting it to another size later on your own.

2) You will need a piece of canvas, mat board or watercolor paper the size of your glass. Paint that with a coat of white acrylic.

3) I will supply the oil color, but FYI we will use Sap Green, Lemon Yellow, Ultramarine Blue, Burnt Umber and Burnt Sienna The acrylic colors are Deco Art Americana[™] Victorian Blue, Camel, Black Green and Titanium White. You need very little paint of either type and perhaps can share two to a palette. If you don't have the colors I will give you a squirt. No special palette – Styrofoam[™] tray is fine.

4) I will bring Windex[™] to wash your glass. The best way to ink is using a Kohinoor[™] Rapidograph pen that has an ink cartridge for permanent India ink. I used a crow quill pen and Daler Rowney India ink. I got the ink at Wal-Mart. Hobby Lobby or Michael's have the crow quill pens. You use very little ink, so I suggest 3 to 5 people go in on a bottle and it will cost under a dollar. The ink does go bad so buy the smallest bottle unless you do ink drawings and will use it for other thinks like Chinese painting. You can't use a Micron[™] pen or Sharpie[™] for this project. I did try a fine point black Nail Art pen from Sally's Beauty Supply but it gives a darker thicker line. (Editor's note: If you still do not know what a Crow Quill pen is check the June Newsletter for a picture..or Google it).

The line drawing is online and also at the end of this newsletter for you to alter the size to fit your frame. <u>Don't do the inking before class</u> unless you *really* want to and are willing to sit quietly for an hour while the rest of the class does the inking.

August 2nd Sharon Poorman will teach a Maureen McNaughton Design

It is done in Acrylics and can be put on a mirror or an approx 6 inch round surface. A line drawing and supply list is at the end of this newsletter. Please bring a lunch because we will **not** be done early!!!!!

August 30th (5th Saturday) Jeanette Seese will teach an acrylic Panda Bear on a 12 x 16 canvas or 12x18 surface of your choice.






