

PARROTS TRAY

Taught by Jeanette Seese for the August 2017 workshp

Adapted from a design by Peggy Harris (Tropical Yin Yang)

Surface: Choose a round surface and adjust the pattern to fit. Suggestions are a plastic or terra cotta planter saucer; a plate; a small pizza pan; lazy susan.



This tray was intended for outdoor use, but, of course, can be an indoor piece.

In addition to normal supplies, a SMALL FILBERT GRASS COMB is helpful.

Technique: Choose your favorite colors. This design was changed from the traditional colors of red, blue, yellow and green to flamboyant tropical hues.

I followed the suggested palette of colors:

Aqua Alizarin crimson Dioxizine purple
Hauser light green Hauser medium green Hauser dark green
Medium yellow Phthalo blue Phthalo green
Light red Black White
Apricot Fuchsia Hot Pink

Find any colors in your paint supply that are close to these if you do not have the exact colors. You might also want to create your own unique palette to accent your décor.

In addition, you will need BLENDING GEL MEDIUM, and a BLOW DRYER. We will be using several coats of glazing. Layers can also be sprayed with LIBERTY MATTE or another similar product. The DRY layers will provide a protected surface for additional layers.

For finishing, use several coats of OUTDOOR varnish if you plan to use the tray outside.

Painting: Prepare the surface; then base coat inside with HOT PINK; the bottom with HAUSER GREEN LIGHT.

Apply pattern.
