Programs -- Workshops Sandy Mihalus

June 2, 2012,...,Milton's Boat with Carole Sheftic .

The medium is Watercolor. Cost \$5.00 It will be done on 140 lb **watercolor paper** at least 12 x 16. I suggest buying a full sheet of Arches or Strathmore Cold Press paper (Michael's or Hobby Lobby) and dividing it rather that buying a tablet that has a lesser quality of paper.

Water Colors needed are: Ultramarine Blue (or Cobalt Blue) Burnt Siena, Burnt Umber, Orange, Alizarin Crimson, Hookers Green (or any dark green)

Supplies:

Spray Water Bottle (fine mist)

01 Black PigMa pen or a size that's close



You may use your regular Acrylic brushes but they should be in good shape. Flats: (Approx) 1 inch, $\frac{1}{2}$ inch and $\frac{1}{4}$ inch, Rounds # 6, # 4 and # 2. #1 liner or your favorite one. A Bristle Fan brush or tooth brush.

A stylus

Paper towels, 2 water containers.

A watercolor palette with divided areas for mixing color or several white meat trays

A soft 2B or softer pencil.

Blue Tape

A piece of foam Core or a bd larger than your paper to mount your paper to.

Optional... An 11x14 mat with 8x 10 opening

NOTE: You will get the pattern at the June Workshop to be put on in class.



June 30, 2012 Oranges with Blue Vase with Pat Otto. Cost \$10 14 x 18 Oil Painting (all day workshop*). Created from a Photo of set up and online class taught by Daniel Edmondson www.danieledmondson.com Patterns and prep sheets will be passed out at the June 2nd meeting. If you need the oil paints Pat will provide them or supplement what you need. Most come in a beginner set. Any brand is okay. The transparent red oxide is Rembrandt and probably not available locally.

IMPORTANT: Canvas Prep To be done Before Class

Transfer pattern, including pattern on the vase, with dark graphite. Refer to small colored photo for color placement.

Note - You may substitute colors of under painting to similar hues. <u>Acrylic undercoating</u>: Paint around pattern with Lamp Black.

> Paint objects as follows: Leaves, Table Edge and Green Grapes - Hauser Medium Green; Berries - Berry Red; Oranges -Tangelo Orange; Grapes – Mauve; Tablecloth - Antique White. Paint dark areas of vase with Midnight Blue. Outline vase design with Midnight Blue.



General supplies for class:

General Oil Palette – Lay out colors in this order on a waxed palette.

Titanium White, Cadmium Yellow Medium, Cadmium Red Light, Cadmium Red Medium, Alizarin Crimson, Sap Green, Ultramarine Blue, Transparent Red Oxide, Burnt Umber, Burnt Sienna. **Surface: Canvas** Size 14 x 18 You may use Masonite[™] if you prefer. You need to base coat the Masonite[™] with white Gesso, then basecoat items and background as instructed priviously. **Covered Palette:** Waxed palette at least 9 x 12 You may tape a sheet to a board and place in a container. I like the Masterson's. A Styrofoam plate will work but is not recommended.

Palette knife Loew Cornell J-15 or Artists Loft 103 are my favorites.

Synthetic brushes: #2, #4, #8 flat, #6 or 8 filbert, #1 liner or striper. You will use a larger 3/4 -1 inch brush for the background but we will probably not get to that in class. You may use your acrylic brushes if you absolutely wash them in thinner then soap and hot water. I follow that with AwesomeTM. If the brushes are your favorites, or are very expensive, like Arlene Linton's, Maureen McNaughton's or Margot Clarke's, buy a less expensive set for oils. I like Artist Loft or Loew Cornell for inexpensive brushes. Do not buy a bagged set as they are probably not very good and won't save you money for the aggravation they cause. Don't buy them through the mail unless you know the brand and brush number.

Thinner: Mona Lisa odorless thinner is my favorite. Please use up your other brands at home. Walnut Oil: M Graham has a good walnut oil, but I bought mine in the grocery store. I store it in the refrigerator and replenish a tiny bottle in my paint kit. Do not bring linseed oil, you may use it at home but not in class.

Paper towels: Bounty or better. Cheap ones don't protect your hands from paint.

Hand towel: Put this on the table under your easel. It keeps any spills from traveling to your neighbor's area.

Easel: Table easel is adequate. You may paint flat or on a wooden "painter's friend" if you like. **Bottle caps**: for your thinner and oil.

You may bring other supplies that you are used to such as a mahl stick or wipe out tool.

Wet canvas carrier or Cardboard box top large enough to carry a wet canvas home in.

*Note for June 30....Bagels and Cream Cheese will be furnished for breakfast but you will have to bring your own lunch as this is an all day workshop.

July 7, 2012 PICNIC!!!! Pat Otto will be teaching techniques and tips for painting on glass. \$5.00 Bring water bowls, paper towels, palette, brushes, glass paints, and your choice of glass you would like to paint. (The dollar stores have several choices.)

August 4, 2012 Julie Polderdyke, guest artist teacher, will be teaching a Sunflower clock painted with acrylics. \$15.00 for chapter members, and \$25.00 for guests. Price includes the teaching and the pattern packet. Our chapter has purchased the clock surfaces for painting wholesale, and may be purchased at \$3.75. The clock works

Julie will provide the paints, and you will need to bring your acrylic painting supplies. THERE WILL BE NO BUSINESS MEETING ON THAT DAY. We will have the birthday raffle.

Julie is a well-known artist teacher, and her patterns are often featured in the Artist's Club flier.

Upcoming classes and seminars will feature an acrylic painted tissue box by Pat Landry, a 2 day seminar by national teacher Karen Hubbard, and a

beautiful 3 piece nativity scene with Pat Otto. Great projects with great teachers! We are looking forward to an exciting schedule for the rest of the year.

BEGINNER TECHNIQUES - PAT OTTO

June Beginner Techniques - Jeanette Seese

At the June meeting Jeanette will demonstrate glazing techniques including wood graining. Turn a plain chest into a family treasure by not only painting the top, but also replicating various faux finish techniques on the chest itself. Wood graining can also be used on mdf or Masonite backgrounds. This technique is used to beautify walls and floors. You will be amazed at how easy and effective it is.

NOTE..... July's workshop and Beginner Techniques will be combined into one... Pat Otto will be teaching us Painting on Glass Techniques. 2. Members are allowed no more than 3 (three) pieces total.


3. Art can be any form or medium: Quilting, woodworking, carving, glass, and flower arranging will be accepted.

Useful Tips contributed by Pat Otto

Enjoy the following question and tips from the Arleta Pech Newsletter: Hi Arleta, I enjoyed reading your newsletter. Thank you for sharing. In spraying an oil painting with it's 3rd spray of gloss, I must have had a drip. Before sealing the painting with the final spray of matte, I noticed the dried drip. It is in the background. What is the best way to fix this please? Mary



Hi Mary,

That is why I gave up spray cans...were the drips and sputtering. Is it a big one? You can try using some of the varnish spray (spray in a small jar then take a stiff little brush and gently work the thickness off the drip) try NOT TO DIG but this is scary and I hate to even mention it cause you can make it look WORSE. Then respray that area. Also I always SET my paintings up when I was spraying so drips had a tendency to fall BEFORE they hit the painting. The other is don't get to close. I USED to save nozzles that didn't drip or sputter and many times its the spray hitting our fingers or disturbing the spray pattern.

I have gone to GAMVAR by Gamblin as it brushes on like water..easier and goes on like a dream. Arleta
